
2017 Annual Report Oaxaca Lending Library February 10, 2018

Things Accomplished

- Maintaining a contingency fund in excess of six months' operating expenses;
- Holding our third annual leadership retreat and planning session resulting in an action plan;.
- Working with Tanya Lapierre, Ralph Gault and Board member John Dumser to develop the website for event registration, the Online Store;

- Supporting our multiple volunteer committees and working with them to increase cross communication between the committees;
- Sponsoring the website <u>www.oaxacaevents.com</u>, the very worthy successor to previous attempts to offer a compendium of event announcements and service availabilities to interested visitors and residents;
- Performed staff performance reviews and planning and;
- Creation of a short-term emergency payroll advance/loan to employees under strict procedures.

Meet the Staff

We have an outstanding staff that works with over 100 volunteers to keep OLL running and serving all patrons and visitors.

Adriana Pérez Maldonado, Library Manager

In addition to supervising our staff and supporting our committees, Adriana oversees the day-to-day functions of the library and staffs the Circulation Desk on Saturday. Adriana does the bookkeeping and works with our accountant to insure we comply with all Mexican financial regulations. Adriana is now in her 15th year with OLL and is integral to running the Online Store.

Nancy Elizabeth Antonio Santiago, Afternoon Circulation Desk Clerk

Nancy has worked at OLL for 6 years. Nancy studied English at UABJO and has fine technical skills. In addition to running the Circulation Desk in the afternoons, she supports the Online Store and assists with book processing.

Carlos Revilla Maldonado, Morning Circulation Desk Clerk

Carlos joined us in September, 2016. Carlos has a degree in Computer Sciences from UABJO and an additional degree in Art and Design from a German university. He speaks Spanish, English, and German. Carlos staffs the Circulation Desk in the morning, checks all donated books against our database, helps us with technical issues like our membership lists and supports the Online Store.

Mireya Pérez Maldonado, Cleaner

Mireya has worked at OLL for 6 years. She comes in every morning to keep our space clean and ready for each day.

Finances

The Treasurer has been Ralph Gault, BBA, MA (February 2017-2019). He monitors and guides all financial aspects of the OLL with support from the committees, our Library Manager and the Board

Membership

Our membership continues to increase, tripling in the past four years. More than three years ago, the Board voted to offer free membership to all children under the age of 18. Families, both expatriate and Mexican, have responded positively. This past year memberships were extended to students over the age of 18 with a credential. The following chart reveals the extent of membership growth in 2017:

The substantial increase in the Student category is a reflection of the success of the work of the Community Outreach Committee in completing agreements with local educational institutions.

Communication with membership, as well as interested non-members, happens by visits to the library but also though our updated website (www.oaxlibrary.org) designed and managed by Tanya Lapierre and our free electronic newsletter under the leadership of Joanie Harmon. Alan Goodin and Carlos Revilla monitor our Facebook pages.

Our hard-working committees serve the membership. A brief report of each committee and their 2016 accomplishments follows along with a salute to many of the volunteers who make the work happen.

Book Committee

Who They Are

The OLL Book Committee is comprised of Peter McCallion and Kevin McGrath, Co-Chairs. Gail Ament, Tom Dunham, Maria Rosa Johnson, Siobhan Grogan, David Myler, Liz Renn, Shannon Sheppard, and Jo Ann Wexler. Circulation in 2017 reached 16,530 individual items. Used book sales earned an income of \$54,588 pesos in 2017. Key accomplishments include:

- Weeded Reference, Fiction and Non-Fiction Collections
- Designed and used new mobile book display
- Hosted Author & Book Talks

- Increased Book Sales
- Welcomed Spanish literature professional to committee
- Enlarged Spanish language collection
- Increased access to DVDs by providing free loans
- Cleaned, dusted, shelved, and organized collections
- Trained volunteers

In addition to the committee members our staff works on the collection. Adriana Perez Maldonado (our Library Manager) catalogues most of our non-fiction.

What Guides Their Work

The library currently has more than 26,000 items in the collection. Managing the collection is the major function of the committee: a complex task of several steps following internal library standards.

Building Committee

Who They Are and What They Do

There are three members of the Building Committee: Tom Holloway, Larry Ginzkey, and Joan Harmon. This committee plans and oversees renovations to improve the physical structure of the library and guides routine maintenance by volunteers and contractors. Many other library members have helped extensively with painting, clean up, and moving furniture and books.

Things Accomplished

- Negotiated, initiated and completed construction of the street/east side of the roof terrace to include new offices for Libros para Pueblos and additional covered meeting spaces and needed repairs.
- Carried out maintenance on the roof after rain leaks had been discovered.

Community Outreach Committee

The Committee for Outreach was formed for the first time in 2017. Since Fay Henderson de Diaz was new to the OLL Board, she worked with John Dumser and Siobhan Grogan who provided excellent and needed guidance and support.

The Outreach effort is designed to promote the OLL services and events young Mexican students, their teachers and their families. The goal is to make the Library more truly bilingual and bicultural in its membership and support and to promote life -long reading habits among young people. The Committee agreed on a list of education focused NGOs and schools to initiate the initiative.

In the first year, a formal agreement was signed with The Oaxaca Learning Center (there had been an informal relationship in 2016), the Fondo Guadalupe Musalem, A.C. and the LaSalle University campus in Oaxaca.

The formal agreements ("convenios") allow students who participate in the institutions mentioned to receive free memberships to OLL. After signing each agreement, the next step was to orient the leadership to our services, then to have them send their staff in the case of OLL and English faculty in the case of La Salle U. The "convenio" was signed with the Guadalupe Musalem Scholarship

program for indigenous women in mid-December 2017 and the orientation for the beneficiaries will be held in February 2018.

Development Committee

Who They Are and What They Do

This new committee came into existence in 2017. Time has been spent in learning about the history of OLL fund raising and also the concerns of the Library Board and membership. The new Development Committee met for the first time on January 26th. Margie Barclay and Kay Burch have agreed to act as consultants.

Things Accomplished

- Created a questionnaire to assess Board attitudes about fund raising. Reported to the Board on December 14th.
- Received Board approval to begin developing a joint Development Outreach and fund raising brochure with Fay Henderson de Diaz.

Events Committee - In House

Who They Are and What They Do

In 2017, the Committee was chaired by Jeannie Kes until March. John Dumser chaired until July 2017. Committee has functioned without a chair since then. During the busy season of January thru March the committee was comprised of: Joan Harmon, Jeannie Kes, Cathy Pekel, Suzanne Lyons, John Dumser, Michelle Verduzco, Peter McCallion, Bliss Wilson, and Tom Holloway.

Things Accomplished

- Over 1,600 program, lecture and event participants;
- Presented 69 programs, ranging from lectures, talks. discussions, book presentations, movies, tours, and social programs:
- Twenty one volunteers served as managers and helpers to present the events;
- Many popular programs such as talks on Archaeology, History, Production and Nuances of Mezcal, History of Oaxaca, a course on Oaxacan Street Art and others drew over 50 participants at each session;
- Contributed \$172.403.00 pesos to the Library.
- New Audio-Visual system in place eased the operation of setting up programs. Special thanks to Tom Holloway, Bill Pumphery, Deron Dilger, and Enrique Cruz.

Events Committee - Out and About

The "Out and About in Oaxaca" program first ran in January and February of 2017 and has been expanded for the 2017-2018 winter season. "Out & About" is the brainchild of a small group of people looking for a way to expand the range of the OLL's educational offerings without overwhelming the Library's limited physical space. The enterprise provides opportunities for

Library members and guests to experience first-hand many of the unique aspects of life in Oaxaca. The program offers weekly tours to various artists' studios, archeological sites and other points of interest. In December 2017 the program sponsored its first weekend trip to Puebla. The program has generated a great deal of enthusiasm and provides a significant financial boost to the Library. It is overseen by a committee consisting of Michelle Verduzco, Jill Duttenhofer, Larry Ginzkey and Nic Garcia.

"Day of the Dead" Cemetery Tours

Since 2012 the Oaxaca Lending Library has sponsored a series of cemetery tours each fall in conjunction with Mexico's famous celebration of "Dias de los Muertos". For most of those years the cemetery tours were managed under the auspices of the "Hoofing It In Oaxaca" program, which provided internet access, a PayPal reservation system and overall coordination. Last fall the cemetery tours were positioned under the auspices of the new "Out & About In Oaxaca" enterprise and reservations and payments were handled by the OLL's new online store.

"Hoofing It In Oaxaca" Hiking Program

The "Hoofing It In Oaxaca" program of weekly day hikes and monthly weekend overnight trips is in its seventh season. It has proven to be hugely popular and has brought many people to their first contact with the Oaxaca Lending Library. For the first six years the program operated independently of the Library, though very closely associated with it. For the 2017-2018 winter season, and onward, the hiking program has been incorporated into the OLL's new reservation system and is now considered one of the Library's many programs which operated under the "Out & About in Oaxaca" program. It continues to be managed by Larry Ginzkey, ably assisted by Albi & Marianne von Dach (day hike leaders), David & Marilyn Albright (weekend trip coordinators) and Nic Garcia (transportation coordinator). From its inception the hiking program was not intended to be a money-making venture. The Library benefitted from whatever funds were left over at the end of the season. This year, though, the Library will see an immediate contribution as the hike fees include a modest charge designated for support of the OLL included in the pricing.

October to February 6, 2018 Summary

Taken together, the three programs above have had a total of 1130 participants and have contributed \$178.109 pesos to the OLL thus far in the 2017-2018 winter season.

Special Events and Having Fun

Special Events which will be throughout the year included the Canada Day and Fourth of July buffet, the Thanksgiving and Christmas meals. These are intended primarily as social events for Library patron and guests.

Although not altogether related to Special Events, but occurring in the winter season are clubs which use the Library. Notably, this includes the Tuesday Bridge Club (all year), Train Dominoes, Mahjong. These Club offerings attract many participants brining us a new audience.

Finance Committee

Who They Are and What They Do

This committee is chaired by Ralph Gault. Members are Judy Burrell, John Dumser, Siobhan Grogan, and Adriana Perez Maldonado.

Things Accomplished

- Developed the 2018 Budget with Committee and Board input
- Ralph, as Treasurer, provides monthly financial results to the Board
- Insures accountability and conformity to Mexican tax and labor laws
- Supporting the Library Manager with financial and accounting practices
- Supported the Online Store initiative by analyzing and selecting a merchant processor (i.e., PayPal Rest of the World).

Nominations Committee

Who They Are

This year's Chair is Bill Watts. Members include Suzanne Grant and Bill Pumphrey.

Things Accomplished

The Committee assembled the Slate of Officers/Director for the 2018 Annual General Assembly Meeting. They are Tom Lockwood, Vice President, Oreen Scott, Secretary, and Jackie Gordon, Director. They used personal approaches, phone calls and e-mail to develop their nominations.

Special Events Committee

This is a new committee, chaired by Michelle Verduzco. The Committee is charged with developing additional events throughout the year. It is expected that a complete program of events to foster community building will be developed for 2018.

Technology Committee

Who They Are

Ralph Gault is the Chair. Members include Deron Dilger, Tanya Lapierre, Dan Walsh, and Carlos Revilla Maldonado.

What They Do

They are charged with overseeing the functioning of the Library's computer systems. The plan for 2018 is to purchase a new computer for the Book Processing Room.

What They Do

- The Committee sponsored two Volunteer Appreciation parties and two Bazaars were held.
- A new Volunteer Coordinator joined our group and has been busy helping to update training information for the various volunteer positions, ie. greeters, book shelvers, cafe help, and Circulation Desk assistants.
- Many new volunteers have been recruited and trained and extra positions filled.
- We now have backup personnel to fill slots to cover for regulars on vacation or absent for other reasons.


- ► Average of 77 visits daily, 439 visits weekly and 1600 monthly visits
- ► Total of 6,900 users, spending an average of 3.5 minutes per session
- ► Top three pages (excluding Store page): Home page (12,302 views), Calendar (6,918 views), Programs (3,289 views)
- ► The majority of our traffic is between October and February
- ▶ Users are predominantly on our site on Mondays between 6 a.m. and 2 p.m.
- ► Traffic originates from (Top 3): Mexico (74.5%), the USA (20%) and Canada (3%)

Online Store by the Numbers

- ▶ 65% of events are being booked and paid for online. (1542 transactions)
- ▶ 66% of purchasers are members.
- ▶ The majority of purchasers are booking for 1 or 2 people.
- ► To date, the OLL Store has tracked 495,000 pesos in sales, 77% online
- ▶ 106 different events are currently listed in the store
- ▶ The most significant and recurring issue is that users don't recall their passwords.



By-Law Amendment

Article II, Section 5 - English Teacher Membership

English teachers at schools with which the Oaxaca Lending Library has a current working agreement of cooperation shall be given a free annual membership to the Library. Such members shall not have a vote at the Annual general Assembly Meeting or Special Assembly Meetings.

Rationale

The goal of the recently formed Outreach committee is to increase our membership within the Oaxaca community. Presently all students in Oaxaca have free memberships. While Spanish speakers can benefit from our collection, students who are bilingual or studying English will find a unique resource at the Library, a collection of 20,000 books in English as well as cultural events in English.

We are signing letters of agreement with schools and institutions that provide English classes and have improved reading habits as an educational goal.. Since the teachers are our partners in promoting English proficiency and reading habits to their students, we would like to recognize their

role in an aspect of our Outreach by offering a free membership. They can be role models as readers and members of the Oaxaca Lending Library.
